Living the Story

³Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. ⁵For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. (Romans 6:3-5 NRSV)

Stories shape our lives. My dad loved to tell the story about the time a speedboat he was driving snapped in two sending him and the passenger through the dashboard and high into the air. He would tell the story in great detail with a smile on his face. This wasn't a fearful experience for him. It was exciting. It wasn't told as a precautionary tale. It was told as a great memory of his youth. I was shaped by his story. He was a daredevil, and I wanted to be seen as one too. I spent many days in my youth perfecting stunts and jumps on my bicycle and skateboard. I was joined to my father's story. We all have family stories that have shaped our lives. Some of them are exciting or funny. Others may be sad or poignant. All of our stories makes us who we are.


In the passage from Romans above, Paul is telling his readers that they are joined to a story that changes their lives, the story of Christ crucified and raised. Paul was born and raised a Jew and celebrated Passover his entire life. Passover is the remembrance of God's mighty acts that brought the people of Israel out of slavery in Egypt, through the waters of the Red Sea, and into the Promised Land. For the Jewish people the remembrance of that story is not simply a retelling. It is a confession of faith that when their ancestors went through the Red Sea and became God's people, they did too. This story shapes their lives. They are joined to this story. Paul is telling his audience that in the same way they are joined to Christ's death and resurrection.

As Christians we are joined to the story of Christ's life, death, and resurrection. During the week of Palm Sunday to Easter, we will be telling that story again in our worship. On Palm Sunday we will tell of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. On Holy Wednesday we tell the story of Judas' betrayal of Jesus and consider how we too have turned from God. On Maundy Thursday we consider how we can live out Jesus' mandate that we have love for one another as we follow Jesus' example to be servants of all. On Good Friday we tell the story of Jesus' suffering and dying on the cross because of his steadfast love for us. Then comes the joyful proclamation on Easter Sunday that Jesus Christ is risen!

When we are baptized, we are joined to Jesus Christ's story. We are baptized into his death. Even as Christ's death on the cross broke the power of sin, death and the devil, so too does our own baptism. We are raised in baptism into Christ's resurrection life. Even as Christ's resurrection life brings life for all, so too does our baptism. Telling and retelling the story of God's mighty acts in Christ's life, death, and resurrection in worship shapes and reshapes our lives so that we too might live lives that boldly follow Jesus Christ in servant love for the whole world.

Join us for the services of Holy Week that your life may be shaped by the story into which you were baptized, the story of Christ's life, death, and resurrection. Despite the current crisis we now face, we will be able to join together for worship online through Facebook or our website. When we can gather again for worship in our magnificent nave, we will celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord! How we all long for that day! I hold you all in my prayers.

PALM SUNDAY




Imagine the excitement... The Messiah is coming to Jerusalem! The crowd presses in around the city gates, straining to see the lone figure riding on a donkey. There is shouting and laughing. Children dash in and out.

People are waving palms and throwing their coats on the ground to make a suitable path for the Messiah, Jesus Christ. "Hosanna! Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" The throng gives their acclaim to the King.

MAUNDY THURSDAY

The day before Good Friday is called Maundy Thursday. The word "Maundy" comes from the Latin word mandatum, which means "commandment." In the gospel of John, Jesus makes this statement during the Last Supper: "I am with you only a little longer... I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:33-35, NRSV).

Maundy Thursday should always be a time of sharing with others, showing loving concern for one another, and partaking of Holy Communion. That is what the Lord asked of his disciples and asks of us.

GOOD FRIDAY TENEBRAE SERVICE

The Tenebrae Service is a service in which we emphasize the solemnities of Christ's death on Good Friday and prepare for the glories of Easter. The word "tenebrae" is Latin for darkness. The church is brilliantly lighted at the beginning of the service. The lights are dimmed as the service continues until at the end, there is total darkness. The gradual extinguishing of the lights and candles is symbolic of the flight of the disciples and the resentment of the world leading to the final isolation of Jesus on the Cross. Just before the tolling of the bells, the Master Candle is carried out, signifying Christ's death. After the tolling of the bells, the congregation says the Apostles' Creed, standing at the words, "the third day He rose again." The Master Candle is returned to the Altar at this time to acknowledge the meaning of the cross fulfilled.



The Tenebrae Service sets a mood of solemnity and somberness as we have witnessed God being crucified. Maintain the silence and solemnity until Easter Morning when the voice of the Angel will shatter the silence and the gloom with the words, "Do not be amazed: you seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen, He is not here." Then your Easter joy will be complete.

Grace Notes

A moment of emergency and crisis often makes us change our plans. Such is the case with this article. Originally, I was going to share with you some thoughts about the Lenten cantata, *The Rose of Calvary*, that the Festival Choir has been rehearsing for several months. All our singers were so much looking forward to sharing it with you on Palm Sunday. Unfortunately, due to the global health crisis, our plans had to be changed and the cantata is postponed to next year's Palm Sunday celebration. I now offer an idea for continuing your spiritual life at home during this time of the coronavirus pandemic.

Although we mainly think of hymns in the context of corporate worship, they are also perfectly suited for use as personal devotions in the home. Hymns are poetic meditations that can be sung, spoken and prayed. They teach about the steadfast love of God and the life of Christ. They provide inspiration for our faith journey, offer comfort and hope, deliver words of forgiveness, reflect on the issues of peace and reconciliation, and stir us to discipleship.

It is interesting to note that many hymns were often written as a response to personal grief as well as global catastrophe. Such is the case with the hymn that was played and sung for our first virtual worship service on the fourth Sunday in Lent when our church was closed. *Healer of Our Every Ill* was written by Marty Haugen, also the composer of *Holden Evening Prayer* that we have been singing for our Wednesday evening Lenten services. Haugen wrote this meditative song during the winter of 1985-86 while his family was staying at Holden Village, a retreat center in the Cascade Mountains of the Pacific Northwest. In his own words, Haugen shares how he came to write both the words and tune to this hymn:

On January 28, 1986, the space shuttle Challenger crashed shortly after takeoff. In addition to the loss of seven astronauts, this crash was a symbolic loss for Americans. At Holden we had very infrequent communication with the outside world, so we did not know of the disaster for a couple of days. When we got some information, we held a service in the evening together, and "Healer of our Every Ill" was written as an expression for our community to grieve together.

Haugen uses the text of this hymn as a prayer for healing, not only of the body but also of the mind and spirit. The refrain, *Give us peace beyond our fear, and hope beyond our sorrow*, is a powerful prayer and helps us express thoughts we find difficult to put into words. The text of stanza three, *Give us strength to love each other*, uses language that urges us, even in times of sorrow and fear, to show love and kindness to our sisters and brothers in Christ. Haugen's hymn provides a compelling and inspiring message that offers hopefulness in times of tragedy and upheaval. It is a hymn that certainly provides solace during these days that we are now living.

The hymns of the Christian church not only serve us well in our worship and in our teaching, but they also offer striking spiritual insight, comfort and direction. Just as the slaves sang the spirituals as they worked in the fields, we, too, can open our hymnals in our homes for a time of spiritual reflection and prayer. The hymnal is indeed a wonderful treasury of devotional offerings to be used at any time and in any place.




