### A Message From Your Pastors

#### How is your Lent going? Can you sense the presence of God in the ordinary and everyday?

We began our year with ordinary and everyday words on the day of Epiphany. Many of us chose Star Words. Pastor Jennifer was given "connection." Pastor Scott was given "rest." We continue to explore how God is guiding us through these words. We pray that God is guiding you through ordinary and everyday words.

As you read this we are in the midst of Lent. We started on Valentine's Day with remembering whose we are, where we come from, and to where we will return – all grounded in that great mercy and love of God in our lives. Everyday, ordinary dust or ash proclaimed this to us. Then we started our way through the gospel of Mark with Jesus driven into the wilderness to prepare for his ministry and the numerous predictions of his great suffering to come. In March we dive into John's gospel to watch Jesus turn over the tables in the temple. We hear about this great love and light in our lives as we are commanded to lose our lives for the sake of the gospel – for Jesus' sake.

On Wednesdays we are talking with one another about God's presence in our lives through the everyday ordinary items – bread, cross, coins, shoes, and oil – all items asking us to open our eyes and hearts to God in the here and now. As you enjoyed that homemade bread from Sweets N Savories Bakery, did you talk with those in your home or think to yourself about the many ways that God provides daily sustenance and give thanks to those who provide for you? From chefs, bakers, food producers, grocers, car maintenance, caregivers, sidewalk repairs – the list goes on. The network of God's love through common vocations and everyday items is enormous!

Lent continues in March and ends in the final week of the month with our Holy Week experience as we journey with Jesus from the raising of palms and giving thanks for this king in our midst, to being fed at the table, to hearing about how Jesus was betrayed, beaten and killed, as we sit and wait remembering who we are in God's baptismal grace, then finally to celebrating once again this gift of life and salvation. The flowers will adorn the sanctuary and children will flower the cross and throw up a parachute in joy!

Then the work begins! Yes, Easter season continues in April. We will jump between Luke and John's accounting of Jesus' teachings. We will be invited to forgive sins, ask questions of our faith, trust in the good shepherd, and abide with Christ in all things. This is how we live as one in Christ's body and one in community with one another. Ordinary, everyday things – lived in extraordinary ways. This is our gift of faith. This is our life together. For this we give thanks!

We pray that you make time this Lent and Easter season to hear and see God in the ordinary, to be challenged by the invitation to live in community and to spend time together and alone with God as your star word guides you in faith.

### **Grace Notes**



Many years ago while serving at my previous church in Evanston, Illinois, area church musicians planned for an annual children's choir festival to take place sometime in the Spring, usually after Easter. In trying to find an appropriate date, one colleague once made the remark that "Easter always seems to be early or late. When is it ever on time?" Ever since I first heard that comment, it has stuck with me; and when looking at the date of Easter each year, it always makes me smile and remember my organist friend.

This year, we consider Easter to be early, at the end of March. But looking ahead, next year's celebration will certainly be late, April 20, 2025, to be exact. Most of us know that Easter is celebrated on the first Sunday following the full moon that appears on or after the spring equinox. It's a moveable celebration that can fall anywhere between March 22 and April 25.

Leading up to Easter we observe the Lenten season for forty days of spiritual disciplines, soul searching, Bible study, fasting, simplicity, prayer, and reflection. We begin our devotional practices on Ash Wednesday, continue the observance as we gather for worship on five Wednesday evenings, and then journey through Holy Week. Ultimately this all leads up to the joyous day of Christ's resurrection and our celebration on Easter Sunday.

Always falling on a Sunday, Easter is a day when the music is glorious, the smell of lilies permeates the sanctuary, alleluias return, and children are filled with the excitement of an Easter egg hunt. But by the next day, many people return to work, the dyed hard-boiled eggs are soon gobbled up, and the Easter candy has all but disappeared from the stores. To many, it seems that Easter is effectively over.

Yet that couldn't be further from the truth. Easter is not a single day, but a whole season stretching from Easter Sunday and continuing for fifty days to the festival of Pentecost. Eastertide, also known as the Great Fifty Days, continues after Easter Sunday as we hear in scripture about the various appearances of Jesus to his disciples. Then on the fortieth day, he physically ascends into heaven. Finally, on the fiftieth day, we are given the gift of the Holy Spirit which guides us into continuing God's work on earth.

Although most Christians are disciplined about observing the full Lenten season, it seems to be forgotten by the average churchgoer that Easter is a complete festival of fifty days. It's a time to celebrate the new life that God continues to bring forth in our lives and in the world around us. A pastor I once knew made it a point that parishioners should find something that brings renewal, new life, and joy in every day leading up to Pentecost, marking the fifty days after Easter Sunday. Eastertide is a time to remind ourselves that resurrection isn't something God did on that first Easter, but it's what God does and continues to do each day.

May this Lenten season be fulfilling and meaningful as we prepare for the great festival day of Easter on March 31. And although it might be early this year, our resurrection celebration will continue for fifty more days! Lenten blessings and a joyous Easter to all!





- M.A.D. Camp performance of Fired Up! was fantastic.
- All of our visioning events have taken place and the Stewardship committee continues their work of naming our collective values, and preparing a guiding statement and tagline to be presented to the council and congregation.
- Due to attendance numbers, the mid-day Lenten worship services are no longer being held.
- Information is being gathered regarding sanctuary renovations. After all information is compiled and drawings are created, the congregation will be invited to give additional input.
- Louise Kroboth has been appointed to fill the open council position with a remainder of 2 years in the term.
- Haverford Systems will be present on January 18, 2024 to address the issues with the hearing-assistive devices.
